Grilled Watermelon

Ingredients

- 8 slices seedless watermelon wedges, 1.5" thick
- · 2 tbsp. olive oil
- Sea salt
- · Fresh ground pepper

Directions:

- Lightly sprinkle the wedges on both sides with salt.
- 2. Stand the wedges on their edges on a rack over the sink and let drain for a half hour.
- Preheat the grill to high.
- Brush the watermelon on both sides with olive oil. Grill over high heat until grill marks have formed, and the melon is slightly softened; about 5 minutes.
- 5. Remove from grill and sprinkle with a little sea salt and fresh ground pepper.
- 6. Serve or refrigerate until ready to serve.

Makes 8 servings.
